Sometimes, I went on tours with bands, Claude Gordon and Si Zentner to name a few. I sang in nightclubs and military bases in the Orient and did two USO shows. I also sang my way around the world on cruise ships.

I worked as an extra in movies and TV (Running Man, Golden Girls and General Hospital, etc.)

Because of the L.A. smog, I moved to Oxnard where my parents were. Locally, I've sang at Café Fiore with Bernie Meisinger's band at Wicked's Brew with Jimmy Calire; many gigs with the Estrada Brothers and area library concerts with my Jazz Trio.

I recorded two CDs, "Gentle Rain" and "Back To The Beginning". Chuck Cecil played two selections on his radio show "The Swinging Years". I enjoy singing and hope to continue

PARASOL PARADE

Did you know that.....?

Second line parades are the descendants of the New Orleans Jazz funerals. The "first line" of the parade was the family members of the deceased, followed by the hearse and a brass band. The "second line" refers to those who join in to follow the procession. A Grand Marshal would lead the band and the funeral party to the grave site.

Slow spiritual, sorrowful tunes and hymns (known as the "dirge") were played as the funeral procession left the church, walking. It was to signify the trials and hardships of life.

After the departed was laid to rest at the burial site, the funeral procession would leave, striking an upbeat tune. As the parade moved on through neighborhoods, people would join in the parade, dancing to the beat of the brass band. They were the "second line". Originally, these revelers carried umbrellas or parasols to ward off the hot sun or rain. Those who did not have umbrellas waived a white handkerchief in the air.

Nowadays, parade goers often decorate their umbrellas and parasols. Next time you have the chance, whether you call it an umbrella or parasol, or waive a handker-chief or a napkin, join in a true New Orleans tradition...The Second Line.
