CHUCK CECIL

A dedicated Patron of our Jazz Club has departed for the Great Beyond. Chuck left us on April 30th, but he will always be with us in our hearts and his sprit will always be near.



Chuck's radio show "The Swingin Years" ran for decades. He attended high school with actresses Jane Russell and Marilyn Monroe, and attended Monroe's wedding in 1942. That year also found him briefly in his first radio job before he was called up for the war, where he worked in a pilot training program.

When he got home he settled in Oregon and got back into radio as the announcer for "Baldy's Band" a popular orchestra. He married the group's vocalist, Edna Brown, in 1947. From 52-73 he worked for Los Angeles station KFI. In the 70s and 80s, he worked at Los Angeles stations KGIL-AM and KPRZ. From the 60s to 80s he also hosted the "Big Band Countdown" on Armed Forces Radio spreading the gift of Jazz to servicemen throughout the world.

Throughout all these changes he ran the show he is most known for. He launched "The Swingin Years" in 1956 while at KFI and only hung up his headset in 2016. The show became nationally syndicated in 1973 and was heard on hundreds of stations at its peak.

Recently, "The Swingin Years" had been produced at Cecil's home utilizing his huge library of 78-45- and 33-RPM records. Our prayers are with Edna and his family; we all shall miss Chuck and that unforgettable smile.

COOL BLUE

After spending 35 years in Law Enforcement, Richie returned to his true passion, the Trumpet. He started his studies in New York at the age of eight. By the time he was twelve, he was already performing as a pro.

While in New York, he studied with the Trumpet Master, Charles Colin. In 1963 he arrived in Los Angeles and studied with Irving Bush, John Clyman and Tommy Stevens.

During his college days, he recorded with the likes of Della Reese, Tine Turner, The Impressions, The Seven Wonders, The Emotions and many others.

After receiving his bachelors Degree and attending Graduate School, he accepted a position in Law Enforcement. During his 35 year tenure, he sadly abandoned his music. Upon his retirement, he dusted off his horn and started on the road back.

Today, Richie can be heard as the Jazz Trumpeter with The Woody James Big Band, The Leroy Lovette Big Band and The Pat Longo Hollywood Big Band. He also played Lead Trumpet for The Clyde Reasinger Big Band. He leads his own Jazz Group, "Cool Blue", and has performed with Nancy Sinatra, Kimberly Locke, American Idol and others.

Richie was the principal Trumpet and soloist for the Los Angeles Police Department Concert Band, additionally he was also the Director of both the LAPD Swing Band and Jazz Combo. Richie also plays first Trumpet with the UCLA Alumni Band.
